HANDS ON LEARNING

Building connections with our community through real-world skills.

Students taking part in Year 10 Product Design Industry classes have been busy learning new skills and applying them to construct useful products under the guidance and expertise of Mr Jenkin and Phil Lawrence.

Students first project was to construct dog kennels. Students were firstly required to interpret technical drawings and plans in order to determine the amount of materials required. Sustainability practices were employed by repurposing wood from pallets. The finished result demonstrated the students emerging skills and another project was sought to continue their great work.

Suggestions to link further with the community led to the idea of connecting with a local kindergarten to construct mud kitchens for outside play areas. Concentrating on the building process, students again utilised sustainable materials. Working collaboratively, students measured and cut each section to size, built the frame, ensured rough edges were removed and cut the hole to place the donated sinks.

The children at Lions Hopkins Kindergarten were very appreciative of the kitchens and have certainly been busy putting them to good use, engaging their imaginations by making lots of delicious 'food', and having lots of fun.

Students thoroughly enjoyed this project and gained the satisfaction of making useful sustainable products.





A great boxing session with great benefits for Our Stars.

Recently, our Warrnambool College Stars from years 8-10 attended Folima's Boxing and Fitness where they engaged in an intense 1-hour boxing session. A lot of sweat, high heart rates, and laughs were had.

During the session, Gym owner Alison gave valuable information on how boxing can assist with aggression management and improve mental health throughout adolescence.

Alison also spoke about the significance of using boxing in a safe controlled manner within the ring and not out in the wider community, she explained the unwelcomed consequences that may occur if physical contact was used outside of a controlled environment.

Alison also described other benefits including physical health improvement, weight management, promoting goalorientated mindsets, teamwork, and respect, resilience and perseverance, and promoting discipline and focus.

To conclude the session the girls enjoyed a protein smoothie and rice cakes with tuna. Certainly a resounding success with the request to do it again from the girls.

Congratulations to alum **David Parkes** who has gained national acclaim, featuring in DRUMScene magazine. CLASS OF 1994'S 30-YEAR REUNION






OUR MISSION STATEMENT
